THE PARISH PLAN ROADSHOW

Last year we asked you to complete a questionnaire covering many aspects of life here in Illogan Parish. The response was overwhelming. Thank you.

Since then, all the information you have provided has been carefully looked at by the Parish Plan Steering Group and a booklet containing all the results will be published later this year.

This handout contains a copy of the information used on the Parish Plan Roadshow. It is not the Parish Plan but hopefully gives you an idea of the sorts of things that will feature in the Plan.

There are many organisations whose activities impact on you. The Parish Plan booklet will help them to make the right choices, ones that residents want or would broadly support.

The Parish Plan Steering group thought it would be a good idea to give you a preview of some of the things we have learnt so far and to show you some of the things that we intend to include in the Parish Plan.

What area does the Civil Parish of Illogan cover?

Illogan Parish is made up of a number of distinct areas including: Churchtown, several farms (Bridge Hill, Home, Nance, Magor, Merrose, Rayle, Park, Trengove) Illogan Village, North Cliffs, Park Bottom, Tehidy and Tolvaddon.

The Parish Plan Process

- Public meetings lead to the Parish Plan Steering Group being formed. Members of this group include local residents, Parish Councillors and representatives of other organisations.
- All residents are asked to complete the Parish Plan Questionnaire.
- Answers are compiled into one document and analysed by steering group members.
- The Parish Plan road show travels around the Parish allowing residents to see some of the initial findings.
- The draft Parish Plan is written.
- Residents are consulted on the draft Parish Plan.
- The Parish Plan is published.
- The Parish Plan is used by the Parish Council, County Council and others to help make the improvements that residents of Illogan Parish want.
- The Parish Plan is reviewed and updated.

What the Plan aims to do.

“To foster a sense of belonging and pride in the place that we live”

“To support initiatives that will improve community safety”

“To work as a community to improve our health”

“To make Illogan Parish Greener”

“To support initiatives that help residents to remain living in Illogan Parish.”

What the Plan aims to do.

“To help create a better educated community”

“To support initiatives that will benefit the local economy without adversely affecting village life”

“To develop safe and sustainable transport for those living, working and visiting Illogan Parish”

“To provide the best possible cultural and recreational opportunities for the whole community”

Some of the things you have told us.

Where do I go for local advice and information?

Where can I buy local produce?

I need a job that pays better.

We desperately need a village hall.

Local produce is often expensive.

We need allotments.

We need a good bus service.

Developers don't seem to listen to the existing residents.

Some of the things you have told us.

There are no safe footpaths where I live.

I can't get off benefits.

I've no idea where the footpaths are!

I can't afford a house here.

I want to get better qualifications.

Vandalism is a big issue for me.

We need play equipment in our park.

Some roads and footpaths are in poor condition.

Some of the things you have told us.

There's too much dog fouling.

There aren't enough community events.

I can't get to college by public transport.

We need better access to healthcare.

What about the litter?

I don't know what courses are available.

We need mobile health services.

We want a greener parish.

Some of the things that will be in our Parish Plan.

- Introduce **community information points** and **surgeries**.
- Bring back **summer fetes** and other **community events**.
- Promote **responsible dog ownership** and provide more **dog waste bins**.
- Promote greater awareness of the littering problem, encourage **more use of existing bins** and **provide more bins** at litter hotspots.
- Engage with those most likely to vandalise community facilities and develop a **sense of ownership** for these members of our community.
- Increase **police foot patrols** in vandalism hot spots.
- Support **green projects** within Illogan Parish such as the “Illogan Green Ripple”.
- Support the introduction of **mobile health services** such as dentistry, chiropody, counselling and mental health support.

- Encourage colleges and universities to run courses that start and finish at times that **enable residents to attend** or to **provide an alternative transport link** such as a mini bus.
- Support projects that will help residents to **eliminate or reduce waste**.
- Support projects that make it easier for residents to pass on **re-usable** items and **re-cycle waste** materials.
- Ensure residents are aware of the **learning opportunities** available to them.
- Encourage local bus companies to provide bus **services that link in** with college and university start and finish times.
- Ensure that future housing developments **provide for the needs** of the existing residents.
- **Encourage new businesses** to set up in the Parish where there is a need.
- Encourage existing businesses to provide a larger range of **produce at affordable prices**.

- Ensure that the **views** of existing residents are **represented** and taken into account whenever **large scale developments** are being considered.
- Re-introduce a **Market day** where local produce can be purchased throughout the day and by residents who work during the day.
- To support projects that **help residents out of poverty** or to improve their financial position.
- Encourage residents to report poor **road and footpath conditions**.
- Tell residents where the **safe walking routes** are.
- Support the creation of a **new footpath** from Tolvaddon to Pool School.
- Work with the local bus companies to provide a **good service for all residents**.
- **Provide land** so that residents can grow their own produce.
- Support the provision of a **community building** at Park Bottom and at Tolvaddon.
- Make sure that all **open spaces** have **adequate facilities** such as benches, bins and play equipment.

What has been done already?

- Dedicated **litter patrols** around the parish provided by Illogan Parish Council.
- New **dog waste bins** in many locations around the Parish.
- Regular **meetings** with the local police and other community organisations **to tackle crime** and other safety issues.
- “The **Illogan Green Ripple**” which is starting in Tolvaddon.
- Doorstep **recycling**.
- Illogan Parish Council grants for notice boards, youth projects and community facilities.
- New **bus stops**.
- Rosemullion **Community Park**.
- Parish **website**.
- There are many active **Community Groups**
