Illogan Parish Fair – 14th July 2012



The show opens at 2pm and throughout the afternoon will feature live music performances, exhibitions and the usual range of stalls including fun ones like a ducking stool and a coconut shy. Gwel an Mor are bringing their wildlife show featuring birds of prey and reptiles and will be giving talks about all their animals.

There will be a range of static exhibits in the grounds of Illogan Village Hall including a steam roller, amphibious vehicle and fire engine. The 1st Illogan Scout Group will be creating a fully functioning scout camp. In the Village Hall you can look at the crafts and modelling exhibition and across the road at The Wellbeing Centre you can have a look at the art exhibition featuring the work of local artists as well as trying out some complementary and alternative therapies. Nearby, Illogan Parish Church will have a local history exhibition, walks and talks and Illogan School will host the Horticultural & Domestic Show exhibits.

In the evening, starting at 7.30pm, we are delighted to announce that the local internationally renowned Cornish Ceildh band Hevva will be performing for us and hosting a traditional Cornish dance night at the Wellbeing Centre (£4 adults, 8 - 18yrs £3) The Parish Church have a fascinating presentation by the local historian Jof Bullen entitled "Titanic - The Cornish Connection" (Free entry - donations invited) and Bronia Saunders is creating a special Parish Fair variety show entitled "The Illogan Players - All at Sea" featuring performances from local thespians and entertainers (£4 Adults, £3 Children). There is funding for two years for the cleaning and up keep of the property. I can be contacted by phone, email or mobile, all of which are on the back of the review.

The Council has now moved into its final year before the next election in May 2013. This term of office has been extended from four to six years because of the adoption of Unitary Status by Cornwall Council and the consequent demise of Kerrier District Council.



Much has happened over the past year and we still have a lot to do in the next, to proceed with the gradual implementation of objectives set in the Parish Plan. These will continue and be regularly reviewed and updated.

Mrs Suzanne Ballinger, our Parish Clerk, has served the Parish Council for the last 12 years and she has now decided to retire on the 30th June after an extended period of ill health.

Mrs Ballinger has given long and dedicated service to the Parish Council and our community and I wish to pay tribute to that and thank her for all her hard work. The Parish Council has developed a great deal in her time in post and much of the success of this is down to her efforts. Thanks Sue and all best wishes for all your future plans.

We now look forward to the summer and a series of community events such as the Queen's Jubilee 'party in the park' on Sunday 3rd June, and the rebirth of the Illogan Village Fair on 3rd June. The Parish gardening competition is being held this year and the Council hope that this will become a permanent feature in the future. The Green Ripple is operating in Tolvaddon at the moment and events have been taking place and more are planned in the near future. Keep an eye out for the newsletter or the notice board outside the shop in Tolvaddon.

All events depend on the hard work and active participation of everyone to ensure their success. My thanks for all you are doing.

At the Annual Parish Meeting I was privileged to be re-elected as Chairman for the forthcoming year with Terry Wilkins as Vice-Chair. The whole council is looking forward to the continuing development of its services to the community over the next year.

1755 Tsunami

On 1 November 1755 at 09:40 the Lisbon earthquake caused a tsunami to strike the Cornish coast at around 14:00. The epicentre was approximately 250 miles (400 km) off Cape St Vincent on the Portuguese coast, over 1,000 miles (1,600 km) south west of the Lizard. At St Michael's Mount, the sea rose suddenly and then retired, ten minutes later it rose 6 ft (1.8 m) very rapidly, then ebbed equally rapidly, and continued to rise and fall for five hours. The sea rose 8 ft (2.4 m) in Penzance and 10 ft (3.0 m) at Newlyn. The same effect was reported at St Ives and Hayle. The 18th century French writer, Arnold Boscowitz, claimed that "great loss of life and property occurred upon the coasts of Cornwall"

Some of the scams to be aware of:

Cowboy Builders May knock on your door and pressurise you into agreeing for them to carry out work or repairs on your property e.g

Home Improvements, new drives or replacing loose roof tiles etc. Usually the work is shoddy and you will end up out of pocket because the chances are you won't be able to track them down in order to correct any problems.

They normally use Mobile numbers.

Unscrupulous Doorstep Traders Use hard pressure sales tactics and often prey on the elderly. Typical offers include overpriced home security systems or free damp proof surveys that can end up costing an arm and a leg.

Counterfeit Goods Producers/Sellers The price of counterfeit goods can appear to be attractive. What is not so attractive is that the quality of the goods is likely to be inferior to the genuine item or worse, unsafe. Counterfeit goods are usually found on sale at Sunday Markets or Car Boot Sales. They range from shoddy copies of branded goods e.g Video Tapes, CDs, Perfumes/Aftershaves, Sportswear, Toys or Car Parts.

Bogus Homeworking Schemes Operators prey on vulnerable people like the unemployed, single parents or people that cannot go out to work. Typical scams include those who ask you to send money to register, or ones that never pay out because they claim your work is not up to standard. Bona Fide companies will send you information without you having to send money up front.

Maningham Wood Nature Trail

Quiz leaflets for the wildlife information boards can be found in Illogan shops and village halls at both ends of the new Nature Trail through the village.

Children can use these leaflets to find their way around the woodland and the churchyard as they search for the answers to questions about the wildlife that can be found around them.

The Nature Trail was first suggested in responses to the Parish Plan a couple of years ago, and it has taken that long for the Friends of Maningham Wood to source the funding for such an adventurous project. The money was eventually obtained from the National Lottery Fund, Redruth Charities Trust and Cornwall in Bloom, and the information boards and quiz leaflets were produced by a Devon company, Nature Signs.



Ever wondered how Indian Queens (Cornish: Krows Karworgi) got its name? The village is situated west of Goss Moor. Here's the most popular 3 possibilities. Each version agrees that the name comes from the name of a coach/post house or inn. The name cannot be traced earlier than the 19th century. The inn was built on a plot of land known as White Splat in the late 18th century. The Indian Queen Inn stood beside the road leading from Goss Moor to Fraddon, just below the top of the hill. The pub had a small porch and displayed as a sign the portrait of an Indian queen. An inscription on the porch told the story of a Portuguese princess who landed at Falmouth in packet days, and slept one night at this inn on her way to London. Her swarthy appearance gave onlookers the impression that she was an Indian.

It has also been suggested that the royal lady was Pocahontas (1595–1617), an American Indian who was the younger daughter of Powhatan, chief of the Indian tribes who lived along the Virginia coast. There is very little evidence to support this story; nevertheless, it is still commonly given as the origin of the name. Pocahontas's name has been given to a modern street in Indian Queens known as Pocahontas Crescent. Up to April 1780, the inn had the name "The Queen's Head". Sometime thereafter, and definitely by 1787, it had become "The Indian Queen". It seems that the name became "The Indian Queens" around the end of the 18th century. The signboard displayed an American Indian on one side and Victoria as Queen of India on the other. (Queen Victoria reigned 1837–1901; from 1877 she was Empress of India.) The pub was demolished in the 1960s and its old signboard resides in the Truro Museum. In 2009 the old stone lintel from the pub re-appeared on a house in Indian Queens not far from the site of the original pub.
