PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN: GRAHAM FORD

This is my last 'letter' as Chairman of Illogan Parish Council and I would like to share with you one idea and 'keyword' - that theme is 'accessibility'.

The Illogan Parish Review is one expression of it and is so very much more than 'us' having a channel to 'you'. This magazine - with its various components and contributors - works hard at enabling the various organisations, groups, clubs and services in Illogan to share their plans and programmes as broadly as

possible. It encourages many folk - as their interests, hopes and talents permit - to involve themselves. It is in shared activities and endeavours that individuals can grow into a healthy, active and attractive community. We can grow the society we would wish for ourselves and – crucially – for our children and others who will join us in the future.

As well as clubs of all sorts and for all ages there is, of course, also the 'us' and 'them' bit. The members, staff and contractors of Illogan Parish Council, as much as possible, try to avoid divisions or disputes. Corporately, we see our role as being part of the 'us' of Illogan. So part of 'our' work is being a channel to all the 'themes' — utilities, Cornwall Council, Whitehall, Central Government, funding streams, various environmental agencies and so forth.

That channel goes/should go in both directions from 'them' through 'us' to Illogan as a whole - and in reverse!

But to be really effective and relevant, Illogan Parish Council can sometimes only open the door/do the research/set up the meeting. 'We' need 'you' to get the vision, the balance, the delivery as it should be.

So we are starting the great adventure of turning Illogan Park (now it is 'ours' again) into something we can access to suit and please 'us'. And 'we' (not just Illogan Parish Council) are starting the hard graft of writing <u>our</u> Neighbourhood Plan to lay out the balance, pattern and content of the future built development of Illogan.

These are two very important ways in the next year or so where we can assess for ourselves and lay out for ourselves the shape and potential of Illogan's immediate future.

The Neighbourhood Plan – albeit an 'official document' – can and must be written in our language and respond to our situation (not 'theirs'). It must be accessible 'to us', 'by us' and 'for us'.

Illogan Park must be open/accessible to our needs and standards (not 'their' budgets and ideas).

Through the Illogan Parish Review, our new website, good old fashioned noticeboards and now Facebook, Illogan Parish Council will continue, I am sure, to do its best to access the talent and wisdom we can all share.

Whatever I might contribute to the next instalment of the Illogan story would be an honour; perhaps we might include either Poldark or Demelza?

CORNWALL COUNCILLOR: DAVID EKINSMYTH

The current municipal year draws to its close enlivened a little this year by another election that I promise not to mention again. It has had some effect on Cornwall Council and things have been relatively quiet since my last report. My work as Cornwall Councilor moves seamlessly between large strategic issues affecting the whole of the Duchy, and very parochial ones largely restricted to our daily lives in Illogan, Park Bottom and West Tolgus.



The strategic issues have included finalizing the budget; preparing a 'Case for Cornwall' to allow us to have greater control over local affairs without having to constantly wait for guidance from Westminster; finalizing the transport strategy 'Connecting Cornwall Implementation Plan 2015-2019' and awaiting Government approval of the 'Cornwall Local Plan'. All of these are available to view on the Cornwall Council website should you wish to do so, and if you do, let me know what you think, particularly if you would like me to raise an issue for you at the Council. I do raise issues myself but as your representative I am much more effective.

At the local Illogan level, top issues tend to do with road safety, litter control, keeping verges and roadsides under control and the usual dog waste and its collection. I am currently campaigning for a road sign off the A30 that will help visitors know where Illogan is, as we are the only community of our size in Cornwall without one. If you are watching Poldark you will see that Illogan is regularly mentioned and there was a sign to it in the 18th century! I think we should try to invite one of the cast to open the Village Fair, preferably Demelza as she was born here in the story (sorry ladies).

More seriously we are about to embark on the production of our Neighbourhood Plan. This is the opportunity for the whole community to have a voice in what sort of place Illogan will be in the future. There is a working group being set up and ideally this is community-led and supported by the local council, not the other way around. So please consider volunteering to assist with the work. We have had two public meetings and there is a lot more consultation to come. All this and other issues will be discussed at the Annual Parish meeting in May and this is your opportunity to have your say. I hope to see many of you there.

Finally I wish to formally thank Graham Ford who will be retiring as our Chairman after his 2-year term. Having had the privilege of being Chairman for the 3 years before that I know how much time and effort has to be put in, and remember all Parish Councillors are volunteers. Graham has carried his responsibility with dignity and good humour and continued to develop the capacity of the Council. This will put us in a good position to take on the extra work that is undoubtedly coming our way. Thanks to Graham and the rest of our councillor team; not forgetting Sarah and Jo in the office and our other contractors who have to give action to all our decisions.

Raised and schooled in Illogan, I worked in London from 1966 to 1976 and am now a retired electrician, having run my own

electrical business. I have been a Church chorister for 62 years (joining Illogan Church Choir in 1952), a chorister at St. John's Church, Camborne, and a member of the Illogan-based Cornwall Gorsedh Church Choir Tereba Nessa. 



Allsorts is a voluntarily run venue that is FREE to attend for local people who are retired, disabled or are affected by memory problems etc. The idea is to provide the local community with a relaxing and enjoyable place to go where they can enjoy a break, share company and chat, and also access Easy Arts and Crafts. Many retired people become isolated because they are caring for their partners who have become unwell; others have been left bereaved and alone after losing their partner and some with disabilities have found themselves generally isolated. Each fortnight brings a new face, a new friend.

The Arts and Crafts, which include painting, finger-weaving with wool, knitting, crochet and card-making are relaxed but cleverly structured by the facilitators. Many people who felt that they had no artistic talents are surprised and astonished to be producing works that are worthy of gracing any space.

The volunteers who facilitate Allsorts support each other to ensure smooth running of the venue. Events are held every other Wednesday; the hall is within easy walking distance from Illogan Village centre on the same side as Boots Pharmacy and is the centre part of the bungalow complex.

GARDENER'S CORNER

As bulbs fade and herbaceous borders start to grow it is clear that summer is approaching. May/June is for sowing and planting out bedding, but with an eye on the weather forecast. It's also time to get back into the lawn mowing regime as the lawn will love the warmer temperatures this season brings:

- watch out for late frosts and protect tender plants
- · earth up potatoes and plant any still remaining;
- plant out summer bedding (but check temperatures);
- collect rainwater and investigate ways to recycle water for irrigation;
- regularly hoe off weeds;
- open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days;
- mow lawns weekly;
- check for nesting birds before clipping hedges;
- lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring-flowering bulbs;
- watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs.

June 21 is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an exuberant burst of growth but this extra light and warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions:

- pinch out sideshoots on tomatoes;
- harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes;
- position summer hanging baskets and containers outside;
- plant out any remaining summer bedding;
- stake tall or floppy plants;
- prune many spring-flowering shrubs;
- shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch.

July/August can often be the hottest months of the year and a great time to sit out and enjoy your garden. Keep plants looking good by regularly dead-heading, and you'll enjoy a longer display of blooms. Make sure you keep new plants well watered, using grey water where possible, and hoe off weeds, which thrive in the sunshine:

- check clematis for signs of clematis wilt;
- conservatory plants can be put outside if warm enough;
- water tubs and new plants if dry, but be water-wise;
- Dead-head bedding plants and repeat-flowering perennials, to ensure continuous flowering;
- pick courgettes before they become marrows;
- treat apple scab;
- clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up;
- order catalogues for next year's spring-flowering bulbs;
- give the lawn a quick-acting summer feed, especially if not given a spring feed;
- give woodwork a lick of paint or preserver, while the weather is dry.

Finally, don't forget the other important asset in the garden you. Pick your favourite spot in a nice sunny corner with your favourite tipple and enjoy!

ILLOGAN CIVIL PARISH: Is Illogan a Village?

Back in 2010 Cllr Holmes wrote an article for our Review and as we have included a map in this issue, it seemed appropriate to revisit the article which explains how Illogan 'came to be'. Since 2010 our readership has changed and grown with the increased number of houses, newcomers taking up residence and children growing up, so there are many who won't have seen the original article.

Illogan is actually the name of a parish, not a village. Technically it is a group of hamlets joined together by housing developments since 1950. The hamlets were once surrounded by market gardens and farmland. In 1985 there were 3,300 electros. This has since risen to more than 4,600.

Illogan Civil Parish extends from Bridge and Harris Mill in the East to Tolvaddon and Bell Lake in the West, from the A30 in the South to Reskageague on the North Coast.

Illogan *Civil* Parish is different to St. Illogan *Church* Parish which stretches from Peace and Carnkie in the South, to the North Coast including Portreath, from Brea Village and Tuckingmill in the West and to Sparnon Gate and Redruth Coombe in the East.

Before 1935 both the Church and Civil Parish boundaries were the same. In 1935 Illogan Civil Parish was 'accidentally' abolished in the Local Government Act which created the new Camborne/Redruth Urban District. In 1985 Civil Parish status was given back to Illogan but as the Government decided its population was too large, Illogan was divided into three new Civil Parishes - Illogan, Carn Brea and Portreath.

Throughout the summer we will be busy constructing a woodland camp using all the skills we teach our Cubs and Scouts. It's a great opportunity to make all sorts of camp gadgets and furniture from natural materials. At the end of the summer season we'll take all of these things apart and leave the woodland just as we found it. It's important our Scouts learn to respect nature and the environment.

Our Beavers, Cubs and Scouts all took part in the St George's Day Parade and celebrations at Heartlands this year. 1st Illogan Scout Group are keen supporters of community events and will be taking part in the Parish Fair on 11th July once again. MICROSOFT SCAM ALERT



If you receive a cold call informing you that there is a problem with your computer, quite often with the caller claiming to represent "Microsoft", ignore it and hang up. It's a scam. Microsoft, or someone on their behalf, will NEVER call you. The motive of the caller is to make money illegally, nothing more. The caller will claim to be able to fix a fault on your computer for a fee. In that way they access your bank account, and can extract further amounts, if the account is not stopped.

Once you have followed their instructions over the phone to 'log-on', they can then remotely access your computer so that it looks as if they are doing some work on it. In this way, they can add malicious programmes to your computer which extract additional data. If the call is uninvited, hang up. Do not allow remote access to your computer. Never divulge pin numbers or passwords—banks don't even ask for them.

If you believe you've fallen for this type of scam, get your computer checked by a reputable company immediately, and contact your bank to stop any further payments. Report the scam if you have been affected to Action Fraud on 0300 1232040 or www.actionfraud.police.uk.

If you have caller display with your phone company, you will invariably notice a number doesn't come up — it's usually withheld, or some other fancy long number which looks suspicious, and doesn't exist if you call it back. I have been approached by people purporting to be from Microsoft, but I always halt them in their tracks by saying, "Computer, what computer, I don't own one." They quickly hang up. Worth a thought.


