PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN: LAWRENCE PAVEY

Well – almost the end of my first year as Chairman, and it seems to have passed very quickly. I have certainly learned a lot!

I would like to thank my fellow councillors, and administration staff, for their hard work and dedication over the last year; I know it's not always obvious just how much they do and, as the saying goes "you can't please all the people all of the time" – although we do try our best, and always put the interests of our Parish first.

However, it can be extremely frustrating when issues are raised that are beyond our control, or are not under our remit as a Parish Council. A prime area of concern to all at the moment is that of planning, where Illogan Parish Council is a consultee only, along with other interested organisations. Cornwall Council can, and seemingly often do, make their decisions that may be contrary to our, and your, wishes. Indeed, a planning officer has been known to say that the objections of local residents is "not a planning consideration".

This cannot be right and so, in addition to the usual end of year budget and accounting processes that are necessary at this time of year, our focus is firmly on the preparation of the **Neighbourhood Development Plan** that is the subject of another article in this review – please read it closely, and respond as requested.

We cannot say no to all development but we can have say as to what development, and where. The Neighbourhood Development Plan will enable us to do just that, and will have teeth when it comes to planning decisions. Please help us to help you.

CORNWALL COUNCILLOR: DAVID EKINSMYTH



It hardly seems any time since I was writing my report for the last edition but so many things are going on that time seems to fly by; I will try to relate some of them as an update. If you want more information do contact me or come along to one of my Saturday morning surgeries (normally the 1st Saturday of each month in Penwartha Hall).

The Neighbourhood planning process is under way. At a recent public meeting a Steering Group was formed to lead and co-ordinate the work. Thanks to those who have volunteered for this long but eventually rewarding task. Particular thanks are due to Jeanette Tapping who will Chair the group. Local planning issues continue to demonstrate how important it is to have a Neighbourhood Plan making the expressed and legally binding wishes of the local community clear to all potential developers.

The challenges we currently face resisting the planned development of up to 33 houses on the Glebe field being a recent example. Local opinion is quite clear that there should be no development on this important open space and the Neighbourhood Plan would make this very clear. As it is we have to resist it by raising the very many important issues one by one. At present the Application decision has been deferred whilst our objections are further investigated.

Road safety and poor parking continue to cause concern. I am working with the police to organise a Speed Watch team that will help to gather the evidence required to initiate action. Some compromises will undoubtedly be necessary but this issue must be addressed before the congestion in the centre of the village gets any worse. Once again thanks to the volunteers who will help with this.

Cornwall Council itself is embarking on a governance review looking at how the various bodies, NHS, Police, Fire Service, Local Enterprise partnership, and the Council itself are currently working and how this could be improved in the future. This includes better use of their combined resources and expertise. The challenges posed by the reduction of resources from central government, and such things as our ageing population and increased demands for housing, medical and care services need some radical solutions.

I am looking forward to the summer and events like our Village Fair. A lot of hard work goes into making this the success it is and it deserves all of our support. I look forward to seeing you there.

LITTER – a growing problem

Drinks cans in particular seem to be everywhere and multiplying. Obviously there are black spots – Spar Lane is particularly bad – but cans and packets can be found all over the area and often quite close to litter bins!

Illogan Parish Council has always put resources into litter picking. We are also considering further actions that can be taken.

Organised litter picking sessions – for volunteers led by the Council – is one option. It seems to work well in other places.

Do we need more bins? If so – where?

The council will be discussing the issue and making decisions over the next few weeks. We will keep you informed.

In the meantime – **PLEASE** – dispose of your litter properly and encourage others to do the same.

Buying Vehicles

There are fraudsters who are targeting classified advertisements websites like Auto Trader to advertise vehicles for sale. Buyers are then contacting these 'sellers' to find out more about the vehicle, and are being told to pay for them via 'Apple Pay'.

In this case the fraudsters are not using the genuine Apple Pay service and potential victims pay money directly to bank accounts in control of the fraudsters. Individuals receive emails claiming to be from Apple Pay with a web link to a cloned website with false terms and conditions of the 'escrow' service.

Any money remitted to the fraudsters is then unrecoverable and the vehicles are not delivered.

It is always advisable to meet the seller 'face-to-face' and to view the vehicle before parting with any money. And if the vehicle concerned is below market value, consider whether this is an opportunity too good to be true.

SCOUTING IN ILLOGAN

Our main news is that Scout section now runs from 7 to 9pm to allow more time for more fun and throughout the summer we will be busy constructing a woodland camp again using all the skills we teach our Cubs and Scouts. It's a great opportunity to make all sorts of camp gadgets and furniture from natural materials. At the end of the summer season we take all of these things apart and leave the woodland just as we found it.

Our Beavers, Cubs and Scouts all took part in the St George's day parade and celebrations at Heartlands this year. 1st Illogan Scout Group are keen supporters of community events and will be taking part in the Parish Fair on 9th July once again. Please come along and show your support for us and the fair!

Beaver section's focus is always on Fun and Friends and is a good introduction to Scouting. Beavers helps our 5¾ to 8 yr olds to make that all important step of doing fun things without parents or teachers watching over them. They get to do lots of creative activities indoors as well as the chance to explore nature and the local area.

Our Cubs (8 to 10 ½ yrs) are currently focusing on earning some new activity badges along the way. Badges are recognition for the activities the young people have participated in and for the new skills they have acquired, so every Cub's jumper tells the story of what they have achieved. Apart from taking part in a variety of outdoor activities, this term Cubs have enjoyed an evening of fun activities with the Scouts over at our woodland camp. They will also be taking part in the District Cubs Sports Day, learning how to pitch a variety of tents and enjoying the family fun BBQ that we always have for all sections at the end of the summer term. As you can imagine there's always lots to do with our Cub section.

Our Scouts' (10 ½ to 14yrs) focus for this term is essential Scouting skills. Recently they took part in the Cornwall Scouts Coast 2 Coast challenge where 4 of our Scouts took on the challenge to walk from Padstow to Pentewan, some 32 miles over two days. They have also cleared away some brambles to make a safe pathway into Mr Richards woods and are already planning a new camp layout and making camp equipment from the materials at hand. Later this term we will be learning how to construct a range of fires and ovens from natural materials and how to cook with them. Scouts are also having a go at team sports this term as we are always keen to try out new fun games and challenges...

I am sad to say that one of our Scout Leaders, Darron Small, has moved away. Darron joined us to help re-launch the Scout section a number of years ago and will be missed. As much as it is sad to see people go we do now have Neil and Andy as part of the Scout leadership team and Jo who has stepped up to join the Cubs leadership team.

TEHIDY COUNTRY PARK

Over the winter a large area of tree felling has been completed in the Oak Wood area of the country park. The trees, mainly sweet chestnut, have been felled to reduce the risk of the fungal infection *Phytophthora ramorum* spreading into surrounding areas of the woodland. The work has had a big impact on this part of the woodland but is expected that many of the trees will re-grow and over 500 sessile oak trees have also been planted to improve the mix of trees and to help the area to recover quickly.



Unfortunately there have been several incidents of anti-social behaviour in the park recently, including fishing line being tied across paths and people taking their dogs into the area around the lake which is designated as 'no dog' area for the protection of wildlife. There have also been some reports of thefts from visitors' cars and we would remind people not to leave valuables in their cars, or any bags on display that could be mistaken for containing valuables.

Over the last few months dozens of volunteers have again been busy helping with improvements and maintenance around the park. The Tehidy Country Park volunteer group meets on the first Friday of each month. The sessions are led by Cormac Solutions countryside rangers and are open to all. They run from 10.00am to 1.00pm.

GARDENER'S CORNER

It's that time of year where bulbs are fading fast whilst herbaceous borders are thriving meaning summer is well and truly on it's way. The planting out of bedding plants should now be in full swing (always with one careful eye on the weather!) and lawns (and weeds!) are again in the ascendancy thanks to the seasonal increase in temperatures.

As we move into June remember to :

- keep on top of the weeds
- mow the lawns
- plant out any remaining summer bedding
- stake any tall / floppy plants
- prune spring-flowering shrubs
- shade greenhouses to keep them cool
- harvest all salad plants / early potatoes
- hang summer baskets and position containers

July can be one of the hottest months and a great time to sit and enjoy the garden but keep plants looking good by dead-heading and watering, ideally with recycled grey water where possible.

Don't forget to :

- keep on top of the weeds
- place conservatory plants outside
- water tubs and plants if dry but be water-wise
- keep on top of algae / blanket weed in ponds
- give the lawn a bit of a feed if needing a boost
- carry out any general maintenance jobs whilst the weather is good i.e. a lick of paint or preservative onto woodwork
- keep dead-heading and weeding
- time to consider checking out catalogues for next years spring-flowering bulbs

Into August, where watering is even more essential if it has (hopefully) been another hot and dry month !!

As this is traditionally holiday time don't forget to enlist the help of family and friends to look after the garden if you go away.

- keep watering, weeding and dead-heading
- collect seeds from favourite plants
- harvest vegetables as they become available
- a good time to prune 'Wisteria'
- keep ponds and water features topped up
- feed soil if needed
- keep pruning summer-flowering shrubs
- air and shade greenhouses

If the weather has played it's part it's a beautiful time of year to sit back and appreciate your endeavours over the year so, find a seat in your favourite spot in the garden and treat yourself to your favourite tippie whilst sitting in the sun (although T's & C's do apply !!) - enjoy !
