However, for local councils much of our time is spent looking forward in order to set financial aims and budgets for the next year. In a trying year of budget cuts from Cornwall Council, I hope you will agree with me that, as a Parish Council, we are getting things right by and large, with the limited resources at our disposal. To use just one example, there have been many positive comments about the new cutting regime for our footpaths which have made them useable throughout the year or, at least, when we've had some decent weather.

As we enter the new year, I would be interested to know if you agree that we seem to be getting most things "right", bearing in mind that some things are beyond our control.

As to the "old year" many things have gone well, among them:

Work has been completed on the changing facilities at Illogan Park to make them more presentable and "user friendly" whilst the longer term plans for the whole park area are considered.

The first survey has also been delivered that, hopefully, will lead to the delivery of the Illogan Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan. It is not too late for you to get involved with this challenging task, the more of you involved the better, just let us know.

The council "new year" does not actually commence until April 2017 so you still have plenty of time to let us know what you think and to set our goals for the challenging times ahead.

Please look for the dates and times of our Christmas events – they are always enjoyable and I hope to see many of you there.

As this is the Winter edition it is a good time to reflect on the vast amount of activity that has been going on this calendar year, and which is by no means finished.

The Neighbourhood Planning Group has now produced the household survey which will provide the base data needed to allow us all as a community to decide on the way Illogan Parish should develop in future years.

The Planning Applications for the Glebe Field and the houses behind the shop in Park Bottom have been 'refused' by Cornwall Council. The public support was extremely important in this and my thanks to all those who have spent time and energy supporting this. The Developers are now appealing these decisions. I hope the planning inspector will see things our way.

The detailed consultation on the changes to the Cornwall Local Plan is now going on and everyone has an opportunity to comment on this either on the website or at council One Stop shops and libraries. Do have your say.

Many of you have told me of your concerns about safety on our roads and speeding in particular and we have been trying to address this. There will shortly be a Community Speed Watch team operating within the police scheme. If you would like to be involved with any of this please let me know. We must change the culture to ensure our roads are safe for all.

This time of year is budget setting time for Councils, for planning ahead to those things to be achieved and finding the necessary resources to do it. As always, sensible prioritisation will be needed.

Although the clocks have gone back and nights have drawn in, we have Christmas to look forward to and another New Year. This has been a year where far-reaching decisions have been made both at international, national and local level that will hopefully lead us to more comfortable times in the future.



FOOTPATHS, WOODS AND GRASS

On your behalf, Illogan Parish Council carries out work in the parish – cutting the footpaths and grassy areas and maintaining Manningham Woods. We aim for quality work and now have a comprehensive tender and quotes procedure in place – details on our website.

ILLOGAN PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY

What is a Parish Councillor? A Parish Councillor is a person who volunteers their time on behalf of their communities. To be a good Parish Councillor you need to be concerned with local community matters. You do not need to be a member of a political party.

Any person wishing to be considered for the position of Councillor on Illogan Parish Council should apply in writing to the Parish Clerk of Illogan Parish Council using the contact details at the back of this newsletter, stating their interest, eligibility criteria (see below) and the reasons why they believe they should be considered for the vacancies.

Persons eligible for consideration must be aged 18 years or over, and:

- is and thereafter continues to be a local government elector for the Parish of Illogan; OR
- has during the whole of the twelve months preceding, occupied as owner or tenant, any land or other premises in the Parish of Illogan; OR
- your only place of work during the last twelve months has been in the Parish of Illogan; OR
- you have during the last twelve months resided in the Parish of Illogan; OR
- you have during the last twelve months resided within three miles of the Parish of Illogan.

You are ineligible to stand as a Councillor if during the last five years you have either been given a prison sentence of three or more months (including suspended) or have been declared bankrupt.

The closing date for the receipt of applications is Monday 12th December 2016.

POST OFFICE SERVICE FOR 4 HOURS PER WEEK?

As an ex Sub Postmaster, I am concerned about the continuing reduction of the Post Office network and would suggest that every parishioner tries to use the local Post Office. Many people may not realise that the Post Office is separate from Royal Mail and is still under Government control.

All Sub Postmasters/Mistresses are self employed and are therefore paid for the work they perform; there is no annual salary and no help towards running costs. A Postmaster/Mistress gets paid per transaction, ie for every stamp sold, every parcel posted, every bill paid, plus other services.

Fifteen years ago, the majority of the population collected their pensions and child benefits from the local Post Office, but changes to the system resulted in these being paid directly into a bank account; this led to the rationalisation programme, where locally we lost Pool, Tuckingmill and Carnkie Post Offices.

It does not cost you anything to use your Post Office and the loss to the community would be great if it goes. Remember with all the Bank closures, they now handle transactions for the big banks. They are open longer hours, with many now offering some services throughout the shop opening hours, including Sundays. Next time you want a book of stamps, just think, instead of increasing the profits of a supermarket, you could help save a local service by calling in at the Post Office.

Whenever possible, please use it as we do not want to lose it!

Tolvaddon Community Fire Station has been open for over twelve months. Since our arrival into your community we have held a number of events which have been well supported. As a Community Fire Station there are a number of things that we can provide which include:

Free Home Fire Safety Checks - In Cornwall, we are committed to reducing fire deaths by ensuring that every home in the county has a working smoke alarm. To make sure this happens, firefighters now carry out free home safety checks and if necessary fit free smoke alarms

Station Visits – At Tolvaddon we are happy to host Schools and Community Groups for fire safety awareness or just to find out more about what we do.

Community Room – At the Fire Station we have a community room that is available for use by local groups.

BEAT THE BURGLAR



Pets – Don't advertise you have pets with window stickers or accessories left in view. Burglars know you're less likely to use your alarm with animals around. Thieves will bribe dogs with treats, or use a brush to calm them down. Having a cat flap weakens doors which make them easier to kick in.

Social Media – Don't talk about getting the latest expensive gadget on Facebook or other public sites, and never announce you're going on holiday. Similarly, don't put a calendar up where it can be seen from the street; a burglar will then know when you plan to be out of the house..

Selling Up – Be aware if an estate agent puts pictures or videos of your house online, thieves will know what you own, where its kept and the layout of your rooms. Hide any valuables before the photos are taken.

In Your Garden – Don't leave ladders or tools lying around; these can be used to gain access. Shred every letter you receive before throwing it away.

Out and About – when parking, turn your car wheels towards the kerb to stop a thief being able to tow your car away. Never put your handbag on the floor – keep it in view, or loop it around your chair. Don't leave your phone on the table, it's too easy to grab. Never leave your handbag on your trolley, you only have to turn for a second for it to be stolen. When paying by card, rub your fingers over all the pin pad buttons after you've entered your pin. Thieves can wipe a pad clean and wait for a PIN to be entered. Then they dust the pin pad and work out which digits you've entered – then use technology to work out your exact pin.

Doors – Keep your keys out of sight and never leave them in doors or label them with your address. A Yale lock is more of an opening/closing mechanism than a lock, it can be opened in seconds by a thief, it's essential to have a deadlock fitted. Fitting a letterbox cage stops burglars being able to hook keys from a table or opening the lock from inside.

Valuables – most burglars will be looking for small items such as iPads, laptops and jewellery. They'll be in and out of your house in moments, don't leave doors and/or windows open. The best place to store valuables is in the loft. Thieves will avoid lofts because there's no escape route. Watermark all your valuables and advertise the fact with a window sticker.

If You Have a Break In – Make sure you have photos of every room in your house. To provide the insurance company with proof of your property, and also jog your memory about what's missing.

During the Christmas Season:

- * Make sure that you make proper arrangements to receive any deliveries. Don't have things left on your doorstep.
- * Try not to advertise that you are away. Turn down or switch off the ring-tone on your landline. Cancel milk, newspapers and any other deliveries. Set a timer to switch lights on and off. Try not to tell too many people when you are away but ask a trusted neighbour to watch over your property.
- * Don't leave piles of presents under your Christmas tree if it can be seen from outside. If you are concealing large, expensive gifts until Christmas Day (eg. bicycles) make sure they are secure.
- * Remember that your rubbish can advertise what you now have in your home. Don't leave the packing materials for expensive items or from specialist dealers outside for long periods, if you want the bin men to take them away put them outside at the last moment
- * Make sure new purchases (and gifts) are automatically included under your insurance policy.

GARDENER'S CORNER — *Courtesy of Trevenson Moor Garden Centre*

Summer and Autumn now seem but a distant memory as we start to face increasingly more rainfall, winds and frosts along with a drop in sunshine hours and temperatures.

December means keeping an eye on winter protection so make sure:

- all tender plants are moved inside / into the greenhouse
- greenhouse heaters etc are in full working order
- outside water points are well insulated against frosts / ponds from freezing
- pots and containers are off the ground, on feet to avoid waterlogging
- all outdoor containers are insulated with fleece / bubble wrap to help protect from frosts
- deciduous trees and shrubs are now planted / transplanted
- Acers, Birches and Vines are pruned before Christmas to avoid bleeding
- all winter crops are harvested
- fallen leaves are cleared – a good time to consider making leaf compost to use next year



January, as far as the garden is concerned, is more of the same – keeping an eye on weather conditions / temperatures.

Things to do :

- recycle your Christmas Tree / shred it for mulch
- ventilate greenhouses on dry, sunny days
- dig over any vacant plots if possible
- repair lawn edges / flower beds and tidy
- clean out pots and trays ready for spring
- plan crop rotations for the next season
- check on protective garden structures to make sure all is good
- don't forget to put food out for hungry birds / wildlife



February, especially here in the West Country, can already see signs of the approaching Spring with bulbs appearing and wildlife starting to stir as light levels and temperatures begin to increase.

Outdoors, as the garden comes to life again, it's time to :

- prune shrubs such as Wisteria, winter-flowering shrubs that have finished and hardy evergreen hedges
- prepare vegetable seed beds
- plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes
- chit potato tubers
- keep the garden tidy
- net fruit & vegetable crops to protect from birds
- divide bulbs and plant any that need planting
- keep an eye on weather conditions as we can still be prone to extremes in temperatures



All in all a lovely time of the gardening year as we move from the memories of Christmas to the start of a New Year and the awakening of a fresh new season.
