A Huge Thank You!

Many thanks and well done to all who attended one of our public events held at the Fire Station, Tolvaddon on 3rd March or at Penwartha Hall on Saturday 4th March.

Thanks to your engagement at these events, which had a really great turnout, we were able to supply more evidence towards building our neighbourhood plan.

The events displayed the results from the household survey which was distributed to residents last Autumn. We also displayed our settlement boundaries and asked if this was the right approach.

We displayed our housing need numbers for the duration of the plan through to 2030 due to our inclusion of the Camborne, Pool, Illogan, Redruth regeneration project. We asked your opinion on no build areas, and displayed a great deal of maps and literature for discussion.

We have now analysed all responses to the event and are moving forward in writing policies to reflect the interests of the parish.

A Neighbourhood Plan is prepared by consulting the residents and businesses within the designated area - our parish boundary, and must reflect the need of those who live, work and enjoy the Parish.

With this in mind we will have representation again this year at the Parish Fair on 8th July 2017. Please come along, to follow the progress of the developing plan. We will also have a space at the Old School Centre, Books and Bits Sale fundraising event on 27th May from 10am to 2pm.

ILLOGAN SPEEDWATCH CAMPAIGN

Camborne neighbourhood policing team have been supporting local residents in Illogan with their community 'speedwatch' scheme. This was set up towards the end of last year with Councillor David Ekinsmyth who had received many reports from concerned residents about the speeding in the village. After some site visits, police and team sessions and some training it is great to see the team out and about in the village having a positive impact on the speeding issue.

Community 'speedwatch' allows local residents and police to be a visible presence, during different times of the day to encourage drivers to slow down. It also offers reassurance to pedestrians who are concerned about crossing the road or simply trying to get around the village.

The scheme captures data relating to the speed of vehicles coming through the village. Most vehicles slow down when they see the team, which is great however, some do carry on regardless at speed. Those that do will have their details submitted to the road safety team in Plymouth who will contact them direct.



The aim of the scheme is to get people to recognise their speed in the area they are driving and to be more aware of possible hazards. It is a visible reminder for those driving through to slow down and keep the village safe.

Ellie Grey, Police Community Management Officer for Camborne Neighbourhood team said, *'I am delighted with the support the 'speedwatch' team receive from other residents when they are out collating the data with the speedgun. I have been out with them in some pretty cold and miserable weather and their enthusiasm never waivers. The scheme has had a really positive impact on the speeding issue through the village and hopefully as more sessions are undertaken, residents and visitors to the village will reduce their speed. You never know when there might be a 'speedwatch' team out and about.'*

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

PUBLIC TARGETED BY FAKE POLICE OFFICERS



There has been a series of recent incidents reported to Action Fraud where a lone fraudster has approached victims whom they believe to be unfamiliar with the local area. They make an excuse to talk to the victims such as enquiring about directions or offering a recommendation for a good hotel.

After this interaction, several other fraudsters will intervene purporting to be police officers in plain clothes and will sometimes present false identification as proof. The fake officers will then give a reason to examine the victims' wallet, purse or personal items. They may also examine the first fraudster's items or try to tell victims that the first fraudster is suspicious in order to gain victim trust and appear more realistic in their guise.

After all the fake police 'checks' are finished, victims have then reported being handed back their personal items only to later realise that a quantity of money or valuables were missing.

How to protect yourself:

- If an individual claims to be a police officer ask for their name and rank, force, and examine any identification presented; this is always good practice but especially important if they are not wearing a uniform.
- The Police will never ask for your passwords or PIN details. Do not give this information to anyone.
- The Police will never request that you withdraw/transfer any money to them or to a 'safe' account.

Villagers can expect to see more of the fire engine in the village as firefighters engage with the public in a range of ways. They will be looking to increase the amount of home fire safety checks they carry out in the village, a scheme that aims to ensure that every house in Cornwall has working smoke detectors (see the fire service website for details). They will also be looking to attend coffee mornings and make school visits to engage with all ages in the community.

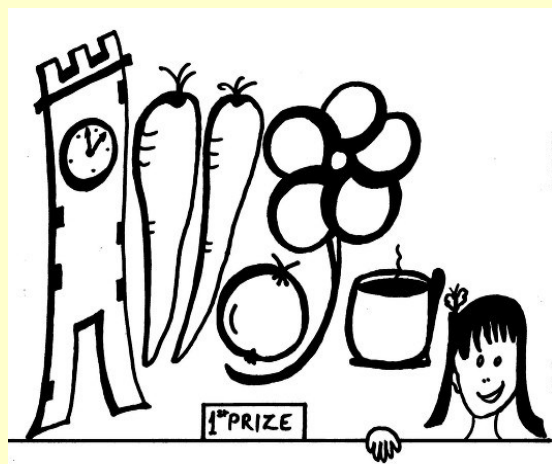
ILLOGAN PARISH FAIR

ILLOGAN WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

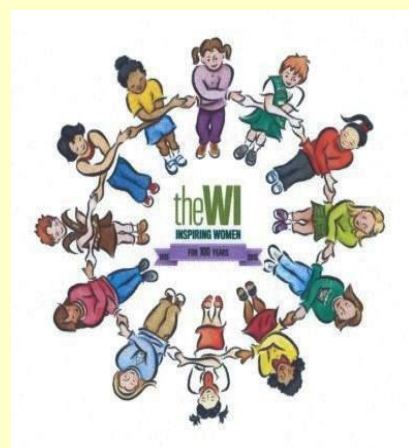

SCOUTING IN ILLOGAN

With the Summer Holidays almost upon us it has been another busy term here at 1st Illogan Scout Group. All sections continue to work diligently on developing new skills whilst building friendships and enjoying a wide variety of fun activities whilst taking on the occasional personal challenges too.

Beaver section's focus is always on Fun and Friends and is a good introduction to Scouting. Beavers helps our 5¾ to 8 year olds to make that all important step of doing fun things without parents or teachers watching over them. They get to do lots of creative activities indoors as well as the chance to explore nature and the local area.

Just like Cubs our Scouts work on challenge badges too and when they have attained them all they will be awarded the Chief Scouts Gold Award. Core skills aside Scouts also enjoy playing team games and making the most of the great outdoors.

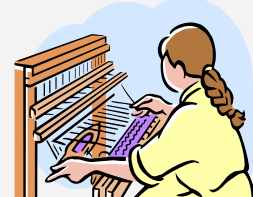

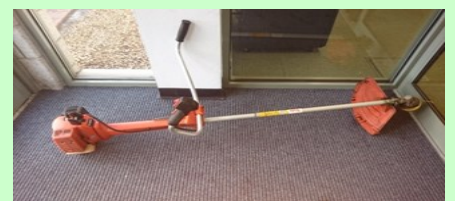
Volunteers

GARDENER'S CORNER by Trevenson Moor Garden Centre

It's that time of year where bulbs are fading fast whilst herbaceous borders are thriving meaning summer and the 'longest day' are well and truly on their way. The planting out of bedding should now be in full swing (always with one careful eye on the weather!) and lawns (and weeds!) are again thriving with the seasonal increase in light and warmth.

As we move into June remember to:

- keep on top of the weeds and hoe dry borders
- mow lawns regularly
- plant out any remaining summer bedding
- stake any tall / floppy plants
- prune spring-flowering shrubs
- pinch out side-shoots on tomatoes
- shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch
- harvest all salad plants / early potatoes
- hang summer baskets and position containers



July can be one of the hottest months and a great time to sit and enjoy the garden but keep plants looking good by dead-heading and watering, ideally with recycled grey water where possible.

Don't forget to:

- keep on top of those weeds
- if warm enough put conservatory plants outside
- water tubs and plants if dry but be water-wise
- deadhead bedding plants and flowering perennials
- Clear algae / blanket weed in ponds
- treat apple scab
- give the lawn a top-up feed if needing a boost
- carry out any general maintenance jobs whilst the weather is good i.e. a lick of paint or preservative onto woodwork
- time to consider checking out catalogues for next year's spring flowering bulbs

Into August, where watering is even more essential if it has (hopefully) been another hot and dry month!!

As this is traditionally holiday time don't forget to enlist the help of family and friends to look after the garden if you go away:

- keep watering, weeding and dead-heading
- lawn maintenance where necessary
- collect seeds from favourite plants
- harvest vegetables as they become available
- a good time to prune 'Wisteria'
- keep ponds and water features topped up
- feed soil if needed
- keep pruning summer-flowering shrubs
- air and shade greenhouses



If the weather has played its part it's a beautiful time of year to sit back and appreciate the endeavours of your gardening year so don't forget a bit of maintenance on the most important component – YOU !

Find a seat in your favourite spot in the garden and treat yourself to your favourite tipple whilst sitting in the sun – enjoy!
