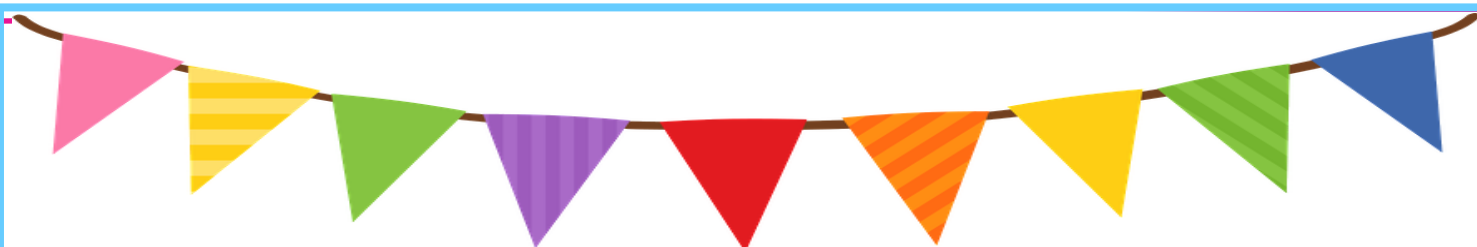

Saturday 14th July, 11am – 5pm**

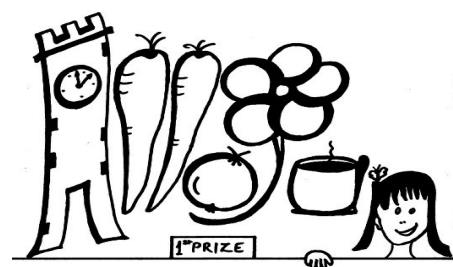
The Illogan Parish Fair will be officially opened at midday by a guest from the Parish who has made a significant contribution to the community. Show cups will be presented at 2pm.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH



False claims of Telephone Preference Service:

Fraudsters are cold-calling victims, falsely stating that they are calling from one of the well-known UK telecommunication service providers. They call victims claiming to provide a 'Telephone Preference Service' - an enhanced call-barring service, which includes barring international call centres.

The fraudsters ask victims to confirm/provide their bank account details, informing them that there is a one-off charge for the service. Victims instead see monthly debits deducted from their accounts, which they have not authorised. The fraudsters often target elderly victims.

In all instances, direct debits are set up without following proper procedure. The victim is not sent written confirmation of the direct debit instruction, which is supposed to be sent within three days.

On occasions when victims attempted to call back, the telephone number provided by the fraudster was either unable to be reached or the victim's direct debit cancellation request was refused.

During 2017, there were 493 Action Fraud Reports relating to this fraud.

Protect yourself:

- There is only one Telephone Preference Service (TPS). The TPS is the only official UK 'do-not-call' register for opting out of live telesales calls. It is FREE to sign-up to the register. TPS never charge for registration. You can register for this service at <http://www.tpsonline.org.uk>.
- You will receive postal confirmation of genuine direct debits. If you notice unauthorised payments leaving your account, you should contact your bank promptly.
- Always be wary of providing personal information, or confirming that personal information the caller already claims to hold is correct. Always be certain that you know who you are talking to. If in doubt hang up immediately.

Could you give some hens a happy home?

Hen keeping is on the rise and it's not difficult to see why ex-battery caged hens in particular make wonderful pets and are great company, each with their own distinct personalities. The British Hen Welfare Trust re-homes hens, both free range and caged, that would otherwise go to slaughter at 72 weeks old. The local team, based in Redruth, holds 're-homings' roughly every 6 to 8 weeks. Since the team was set up in April 2016 it has found homes across West and North Cornwall for 4,000 hens.

Once you have kept ex-battery hens you will never want to be without them. Seeing a hen fresh out of her cage enjoying the sunshine, scratching for bugs and slugs and dust bathing is one of life's pure joys. Although they may be looking a little tatty at first, after a pedicure and a few days of fresh air they will start to grow their new feathers and become real characters. THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

Independent Living Service Handy Van Service

I would like to introduce my self to you, the reader, give you a brief history of my life. I will highlight a service that is local to you and at some point I may be able to help with any small DIY jobs or problems that you may be experiencing should the reader, friends or family meet the criteria of the Handy Van Service.

My name is Ian Woodhead and I have lived in Illogan for 36 years and have no intention of leaving the area that I love. I have been married for 40 years to Lynda. We have 2 sons, 2 daughters-in-law and 3 grand daughters. All of them a delight!

In my previous life I served in the Royal Navy (Fleet Air Arm – Aircraft Handler) for 34 years. I joined as a Junior Naval Airman 2nd Class in 1972 and retired from the navy in 2006 as Warrant Officer 1st Class. On retiring from the service in 2006 I did local voluntary work before taking up a post with the Royal British Legion (TRBL) Handy Van Service in October 2008.

What is TRBL Handy Van Service & Who is eligible for the service?

The Royal British Legion Handy Van Service is a FREE service for people who are aged 70 or over. In some circumstances this service may be extended to people who are younger. It is always worth making a call the service is VERY flexible! Having done this job for 10 years it always amazes me when I hear about the amount of people out there in Cornwall who think that they are not eligible for the service because he or she only did national service!!! These are exactly the people that the service was created for. **Anyone** who has completed 7 days paid service in the Armed Forces (either 70 years ago or 7 weeks ago) qualify for the Handy Van service. This includes spouse/partner and dependents (up to age of 18). Additionally, those individuals who have completed national service or have served within a conflict zone in the Royal Fleet Auxiliary, Merchant Navy and numerous other agencies who have helped in support of the armed forces also qualify. Eligibility for any RBL assistance is based on an individual basis and that individual **does not have to be a member of the Royal British Legion to qualify.**

What does the Handy Van Fitter Do?

I provide a free service to Ex-Armed Forces personnel, veterans and/or their dependants with home repairs and maintenance allowing them to remain safe in their homes. It is a 'Low Level Maintenance' service that is provided. In simple terms I will do the jobs around the home that can't be done any more either through age or disability or because the person that used to do those simple DIY jobs is no longer around! Here is a very brief sample of the jobs undertaken if circumstances permit:

Household Safety Checks (Security), Fitting Aid & Adaptations, Home Fire Safety Checks (working in partnership with Cornwall Fire & Rescue Service) installing & testing Smoke & Carbon monoxide alarms, putting mirrors and pictures up, bathroom cabinets, cleaning out gutters (bungalows only), building & fitting small ramps, half steps, fitting hand rails in the bathroom or by the front/back door, installing galvanized rails (Kee Klamp Rails) up steps & slopes that are difficult to walk up/down safely, install care phones, put up curtain rails & poles. Fit the light bulb (more people end up in hospital through 'slips, trips and falls'). And loads more jobs. There are no silly jobs! Let The Handy Van Fitter Do The Work!

How Do I Get In Touch With The Service?

Simple: If you feel that you qualify for the service all you need to do is call TRBL Contact Centre on: 0808 802 8080 or my number: 07799581008 and I will pass your details/ request on to the appropriate person for action.

Keeping the Graveyard Tidy

St. Illogan churchyard is one of the largest in Cornwall and many hold it to be a significant asset in our village. Keeping the 5 acres reasonably tidy is the responsibility of a small group of hard working volunteers under the direction of Mr David Glasson and his wife Jean. The volunteer group meet most Thursday mornings when mowers will be traversing the many pathways and the snap of clippers is heard as the encroaching brambles are cut back.

Since the churchyard was designated as a 'living churchyard' it has been our intention to keep a balance between pleasant access for visitors and sufficient variety of habitat for wildlife especially birds.

Next time you visit, ponder a moment to hear the powerful song of the wren, amazingly one of our smallest birds which chooses to spend much of its time feeding and nesting in dense patches of brambles where it is protected from predators including domestic cats.

The churchyard has notices reminding dog walkers that their pets should be kept on a lead here so that they do not disturb those who come to care for family graves. Use of the churchyard paths is a privilege granted by the church authorities and should not be abused.

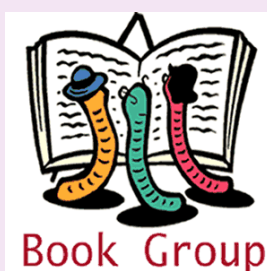
Also we politely insist that dog droppings must be picked up and deposited in the bins provided. Many people do not realise that dog poo may contain several very nasty infections and it is quite wrong for children who walk the Maningham pathway and through the churchyard to school to run the risk of picking up infections on their shoes.

If anyone wishes to assist as a churchyard volunteer for the whole or part of the morning, they would be most welcome to come along on a Thursday morning, meet the group, do some gentle trimming and enjoy a hot drink. It is good exercise and cheerful company!

The Minor Injuries & Primary Care Unit is open every day (including public holidays) between 8am and 10pm with a Doctor being present most days from 11am.

GARDNER'S CORNER – *Courtesy of Trevenson Moor Garden Centre*

It's that time of year where bulbs are fading fast whilst herbaceous borders are thriving meaning summer is well and truly on it's way with the planting out of bedding now in full swing (always with one careful eye on the weather!)

June 21st is the Summer Solstice (longest day) with the extra light and warmth encouraging the garden to put in a burst of growth but this also means weeds see their opportunity, so:

- keep on top of the weeds
- mow the lawns
- plant out any remaining summer bedding
- stake any tall / floppy plants
- prune spring-flowering shrubs
- shade greenhouses to keep them cool
- pinch out sideshoots on tomatoes
- harvest all salad plants / early potatoes
- hang summer baskets and position containers



July can be one of the hottest months and a great time to sit and enjoy the garden but keep plants looking good by dead-heading and watering, ideally with recycled grey water where possible.



Don't forget to :

- keep on top of the weeds
- deadhead bedding plants and repeat-flowering perennials to encourage flowering
- place conservatory plants outside
- water tubs and plants if dry but be water-wise
- keep on top of algae / blanket weed in ponds
- give the lawn a bit of a feed if needing a boost
- carry out any general maintenance jobs whilst the weather is good

- i.e. a lick of paint or preservative onto woodwork
- clear algae, blanket weed and any debris from ponds keeping them topped up

Into August, where watering is even more essential if it has (hopefully) been another hot and dry month!!

As this is traditionally holiday time don't forget to enlist the help of family and friends to look after the garden if you go away.

- keep watering, weeding and dead-heading
- collect seeds from favourite plants
- harvest vegetables as they become available
- a good time to prune 'Wisteria'
- keep ponds and water features topped up
- feed soil if needed
- keep pruning summer-flowering shrubs
- air and shade greenhouses
- a good time to start considering/planning next Spring's bulbs



If the weather has played it's part it's a beautiful time of year to sit back and appreciate your endeavours over the year and give yourself a pat-on-the-back!
