

#### COUNCILLOR DAVID EKINSMYTH

Hello again. I am still finding it hard to believe that this incredible summer weather has lasted so long! Although a little too warm for some it has enabled our community to hold its two major events in perfect conditions, I refer to the Parish Fair and Illogan School Summer Fete. Both were very successful and I was delighted to be able to meet so many of you and have a chance to chew over matters in the Parish. I always value these more informal contacts and learn a lot from them. My thanks as always to all the volunteer helpers that work so hard to ensure the success of these events. In the current climate of severe cuts on all public services and bodies volunteers are vital to the smooth running and indeed maintenance of so much.

Speaking of volunteers my thanks to those who signed up to the Community Speed Watch Team at the Fair. As you will have seen we now have our own gear and it is my intention to start again in the Autumn. Training will be provided to all volunteers. We could do with a few more people in the team so do get in touch with me to discuss it further. We need to take action to ensure our roads are as safe as we can make them and this is one significant step in the right direction.

Interesting news from Cornwall Council includes:

- progress in the discussions with Government Ministers over the second phase of the Devolution Deal and you can check this out on the Cornwall Council Website under "New Frontiers"
- the first phase of the pledge to build 1000 new houses by 2020 is under way and one test site can be seen at Tolvaddon. These are social housing schemes mainly for rent but built to a higher specification than is usually provided by commercial developers.
- Agreement with Virgin on the development of a Spaceport at Newquay Airport that will bring high technology jobs and a boost to our local economy if it all comes to fruition.

#### **VANDALISM AND ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR IN ILLOGAN PARK**

The Parish Council are concerned that there have been a number of incidents of vandalism at the Park. In one such incident vandals had set fire to the new bench in the Children's play area; it will cost taxpayers £100 to replace the damaged plank.

Please contact the Police immediately if you witness any vandalism and as soon as possible afterwards, contact the Parish Council to advise them of what you witnessed. #### **MESSAGE FROM THE POLICE**

Police have been informed of some anti-social behaviour and damage caused in Illogan Park. The park is a great area for families, sports teams, dog walkers etc, to enjoy and any unacceptable behaviour will be addressed and dealt with.

Police will patrol the area when possible though should you witness any behaviour that causes harassment, alarm and distress please call Police straight away using the 101 or 999 phone number.

The 999 number should be used in an emergency and 101 is the non-emergency number.

You should use 999 if;

- A crime is in progress
- Someone suspected of a crime is nearby

..........

- If there is danger to life.
- Violence is being used or threatened
- It's an emergency

If you do not need an emergency response then you should call 101 or use our online reporting form on our website

#### **HIGHWAY CONCERNS**

There continues, at an ever increasing level, concern as to the safety of the road leading from Illogan Downs to Penpraze, from the edge of Park Bottom through the Merrose Lane End junction past East Lodge towards Gwel an Mor.

Currently, there is no speed limit from Rosenannon Lane outwards and there are no paved pedestrian footways.

Over the years, there have been a number of collisions along this stretch and many of us have been witness to these. There have been two in the last three months, fortunately not serious enough to cause injury or death. So, for instance, it is not clear yet whether the incident reported to the office by a member of the public in July has involved the police service.

There are suggestions – apparently undergoing a further review – for a roundabout or such -like at the Merrose Lane End junction. At the moment three out of the four corner verges are being kept cut and clear by the neighbouring property owners.

This is a situation needing informed and constructive "data" as well as robustly argued suggestions. One way of achieving this will by means of various monitoring devices: there have been a few such surveys done here over the last thirty years or so.

Accordingly, Illogan Parish Council is asking you please to share all "experiences" along this road – preferably as quickly as possible at or after the event. In particular, we are concerned to know about "near misses" and occasions not involving police attendance. The information will be "anonymised" but will be used to inform any efforts to control this increasingly worrying situation. Contact either/both the Office and/or a local Councillor; the details are listed on the back of this review.

#### REMEMBRANCE DAY

As the evenings draw in we think of annual occasions and this year is no different when our thoughts turn to those who gave their lives in both World Wars and subsequent conflicts. This year is particularly significant as the Centenary Anniversary of the ending of the First World War.

We are currently knitting poppies to create a panel to be laid at the Remembrance Parade through the village in November 2018 and are looking for people who could knit poppies and contribute to this event. It could represent a member of your family perhaps or any of the unknown soldiers, airmen, sailors both merchant and royal from Illogan. We wish also to knit poppies to represent the many

animals killed in war. These poppies are purple, whilst those representing the Fallen Dead are of course reds of many shades.

#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

#### TV PROVIDERS DISCOUNT FRAUD

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) have noticed an increase in Action Fraud reports where fraudsters are offering a discount on Television service provider subscriptions. Fraudsters are cold-calling victims, purporting to be from a Television (TV) provider offering a discount on their monthly subscription. Victims have been told the following: their subscription needs to be renewed; that part or all, of the TV equipment has expired and they are due an upgrade on the equipment/subscription. In order to falsely process the discount, the fraudster asks victims to confirm or provide their bank account details. The scammers may also request the victim's identification documents, such as scanned copies of passports.

The fraudsters are using the following telephone numbers: "08447111444", "02035190197" and "08001514141". The fraudster's voices are reported to sound feminine and have an Asian accent. Later victims make enquiries and then discover that their TV service provider did not call them and that the fraudster has made transactions using the victim's bank account details.

This type of fraud is nationwide. Since the beginning of this year (2018), there have been 300 Action Fraud Reports relating to this fraud. From the reports received, victims aged over 66 seem to be the most targeted.

What you need to do

- Don't assume a phone call or email is authentic: Just because someone knows your basic details (such as your name and address or even your mother's maiden name), it doesn't mean they are genuine. Criminals can exploit the names of well-known companies in order to make their scams appear genuine.
- Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision: a genuine company won't force you to make a financial decision on the spot. Always be wary if you're pressured to purchase a product or service quickly, and don't hesitate to question uninvited approaches in case it's a scam.
- Stay in control: Have the confidence to refuse unusual requests for personal or financial information. Always contact the company yourself using a known email or phone number, such as the one written on a bank statement or bill.

This is a message for residents to make you aware that we have received reports in the Redruth and Truro area of rogue traders cold calling offering gardening work.

Excessive amounts have been charged for little to no work.

Please do not agree to work offered by unsolicited doorstep callers, the risks are high.

Take time to get recommendations from friends/family, get quotes from reputable businesses you trust and make your decision on who to use in your own time.

If you are concerned someone is at risk, always call the police.

If you are concerned roque traders are operating in your area, always report it.

If someone knocks on your door and you are not sure, don't open the door.



#### **DUCHY COLLEGE**

Double Celebration as Thousands explore Campus

A record number of visitors enjoyed a free day out at Duchy College Rosewarne's annual Open Day at the end of June. Over three thousand people, including their four-legged friends, joined staff and students at the picturesque rural campus to find out what exactly goes on behind the College's gates.





This year marks the 25th anniversary of Duchy College Rosewarne providing unique courses that initially were land and animal based and now include a diverse range of subjects including teacher training and counselling.



Before the College took up residence at Rosewarne in 1993 the land was used as an Experimental Horticulture Station for trials of flowers, vegetables and fruit. Andrew Tompsett, one of the former Deputy Directors of the station, joined the celebration and gave a wonderful overview of the rich history of Rosewarne before planting a commemorative tree. Andrew explained; "I had a wonderful time here working with many fantastic colleagues and research projects. After it was closed in 1989 it was great to see the doors reopen as a college."


Members all find new authors to read in this way, some being recommended by members who have already read a title or are familiar with other work of the author.



#### THE OLD SCHOOL CENTRE

2018 has been a good year so far with new bookings coming in for regular groups and for training events.

We have a number of children's groups using the Centre including the Guides, Brownies, Rainbows, a Sing and Sign Group for babies and toddlers, a Bopping Mums Group, and several Home Education Groups including 'Cornwall Techie Tinkers' (Science, technology, video games).

During the Summer, our new Garden Shed was installed funded by the COOP Community Fund and Redruth Charity Trust.

#### PLAYGROUND YEARS PROJECT

Our Playground Years Project recently celebrated the Heritage Lottery Funding by using some of the new equipment purchased to screen our 9 minute Trailer to advertise the Project. The screening was an invitation only event for all those who took part in some way. We are delighted with the results and those who have seen it enjoyed it. Our thanks go to Cornwall based film makers Kieran Brimson and Bob Berry who gave their time and expertise.



The film was made possible through the generosity of Cornwall based film makers Kieran Brimson and Bob Berry and gives an insight to Illogan School days experienced during the 1940s to 1960s.

Ex pupils were invited to talk about their memories, and present day Illogan School pupils donned 1940s costumes to replicate playground games.

The Old School Centre's Manager, Jeanette Tapping stated 'in 2010 we were given a set of photographs of Illogan School days dating from the 1950s to 1970s that had been held in safe keeping by the Old School's last Head Master, Mr Luke'.

Mr. Luke's collection was brought to the Centre by June Jervis, one of the Old School's ex dinner ladies whose husband, Ray recalled a memory of standing in the Assembly Hall looking out the window at planes coming in to bomb Portreath Air Field during WW2. 1950s photos of the Assembly Hall filled with children sat at their desks making Christmas Lanterns and Chains brought the history of the building alive.

Since 2010, The Centre has displayed the photos at Open Days and the collection has grown and now also includes ex Head Master Mr Stone's collection. With more images and memories of the Old Illogan School being given to the Centre each year the Trustees decided, in 2014, to preserve them for future generations as The Playground Years archive.

Jeanette stated, 'with the help of Azook in Redruth and volunteer Archivist Maria Roskrow, we have digitized and recorded all the initial stock of photos. The HLF grant will enable us to continue this work at The Centre and to show them to the public. We are planning a longer documentary film once we have obtained funding.'

The first public showing of the film will be during our Community Hub Day, Saturday October 13th between 10am and 2pm. We would love to talk to you about getting involved in the Playground Years Project. Starting in the Autumn, we will have set dates to bring in images for scanning.

### **GARDENER'S CORNER**by Andrew Tompsett

September is usually a beautiful month, a time to rest and enjoy the gradual shutting down of the summer season. Although many of our ornamentals are past their best there are several that are at their prime. Among these I would include nerines, Michaelmas daisies and Japanese anemones and the lovely shrub *Abelia* which in my garden usually attracts the wonderful humming- bird hawk moth.



However, there are still important jobs to do!

#### In the flower garden:

Order your spring-flowering bulbs, especially daffodils which do best planted early. Tulip bulbs may be planted any time up to November, but do store them properly so they don't root in the bag. Prepared hyacinths will have been cold stored for early flowering so it is essential to pot them early and keep them cool and damp with some heavy gravel on top to prevent the bulbs lifting up as the roots grow. Now is the time to take cuttings of *Osteospermum* (African daisies) given winter protection these can replace your older plants which may be frosted next winter. Roses may have straggled over your pathways so cut them back and prune any bush roses so that they are not rocked by winter gales.

#### Vegetable garden



Sow lettuce seed in trays or cells using winter-hardy Winter Density or Winter Gem. You will enjoy these in April. Protect from slugs. Dig over some soil to sow Broad beans variety Aquadulce in October. Clear old runner bean plants and manure the ground to grow them again in the same place. This is a crop not requiring rotation so leave the posts where they are.

#### Fruit garden

Raspberries - There are two kinds: Summer fruiting ones (known as Floricane) need all old canes to be cut away leaving the new leafy ones. Autumn fruiting varieties (known as Primocane) need all to be cut down now. Raspberries are wonderful and bees love the flowers.

#### Greenhouse jobs

Allow tomatoes to go on producing as long as possible. When they are finished, clear out promptly and clean the greenhouse thoroughly. Prepare good soil for next year's crop as old tomato soil will often contain root disease.
