
CHAIRMAN OF THE PARISH COUNCIL COUNCILLOR DAVE CRABTREE

This is my last report as Chairman of Illogan Parish Council and it has been an honour to be in the position for three years, even with all the challenges that Covid threw into the mix.

It is only right that I also thank all my fellow Councillors for their support during these extraordinary times and especially our new Councillors who have provided some new ideas and helped to move projects forward.

It may be over four months since the events but was rewarding to see so many people attend the Christmas light switch on events and the Camborne Youth Band leading the Illogan Lantern Parade. The

wonderful atmosphere created was enhanced with Santa appearance and participation.



Unfortunately, the opening of the new public toilets has taken longer than anticipated due to the waiting time for a contractor to be able to rectify some drainage issues, however after many years of having unuseable facilities a few extra weeks is not going to make much difference.

The new Parish Council Office and Community Room is on order and should be in situ by the summer along with new parking facilities and a perimeter path around the park so that it is accessible to everybody.

May I finish off by also thanking the Clerk, Sarah for her help throughout, even though she had two sons within the last three years.

CORNWALL COUNCILLOR COUNCILLOR DAVE CRABTREE

It does not seem possible that it is nearly a year since I was elected to represent the residents of the Illogan and Portreath Electoral Division and I must admit, I have learnt a lot since May 2021 and had some interesting challenges.

Last year I arranged for speed monitoring equipment to be installed in Alexandra Road, Illogan and Clifton Road, Park Bottom, as it was revealed that 25% of vehicles on Alexandra Road and 50% of vehicles on Clifton Road exceed the speed limit. The Police are aware of the main periods when excess speed occurs and will be using this to make best use of their resources. I am seeking volunteers to help with a Speedwatch in the area, where the initial training is carried out online and will require a minimum commitment of a couple of hours per month. If you are interested in helping, please contact me.

I am currently negotiating with both Cormac and Coastline for improvement work to be carried out in the Coronation Road/Oxland Road area which has suffered through years of neglect. It is hoped that there will be a realignment of the junction of Bridge Road and Church Road soon so that buses are no longer using the wrong side of the road.

The charging to park in Tehidy Woods has caused great upset amongst locals, who account for 88.8% of visitors and I have strongly opposed this tax on the local community, many who use it for their daily exercise. As the local member I was not notified that this consultation was going to take place and have asked for this proposal to be withdrawn. Hopefully by the time this is published this should be confirmed.

After two years we can at last hold our Annual Event. This year, we have what we think is going to be the best yet.


On stage we have two great tribute acts, Beautiful South West, and Mr & Mrs Blue Sky (ELO).

CORONATION ROAD/OXLAND ROAD RESIDENTS SURVEY

- 2. Remove verges and replace with dropped kerbs to provide off road parking in front gardens
- 3. Install a One-Way system around the estate with parking bays marked on the road and verges restored
- 4. Leave the verges as they are now

Public Toilets

The public toilets have been installed in the Park. The repair works to the existing drains have taken longer than expected due to the contractor's workload. It is hoped that the toilets will be open for use at the beginning of June 2022.



Parish Council Office and Community Room

Planning permission has been granted for a Parish Council Office to be erected in the Park. Contractors have been appointed. It is hoped that the Office will be complete and open to the public by the autumn of 2022.



Changing Facilities

The changing facilities received a complete refurbishment during late summer 2021. The refurbishment has greatly improved the look of the changing room from the outside. It has also made the facilities much more usable internally. The Changing Rooms will continue to serve the local Football and Rugby Teams for many years to come.



Perimeter Path

Tenders are being sought for the installation of the perimeter path and associated seats and picnic benches. It is hoped that a contractor can be appointed and the work completed so that the benches and seating can be enjoyed through the summer months.

The scheme comprises a 1.7-metre-wide tarmac pathway generally following the eastern and southern boundary of the park.

At the Paynters Lane End entrance there is a wider section of surfacing to provide an area for seating with staggered picnic benches. This will offer a full view of the park across both playing pitches. Running down the eastern side of the park the footpath will pick up the entrances to Sunnyside Park. Two of the entrances will have larger tarmac hard standing to allow for 2 seating benches. The southeast corner of the park where it joins the footpath off Spar Lane will be left as is due to the high-water table and poor drainage. The pathway continues along the southern boundary meeting up with the existing tarmac pathway in the formal part of the Park. To the northern side of the Park we will extend the new WC block access pathway along the front of the children's play park providing safe level dry access across the site. A small link section of pathway will be added to the rear of the WC block to aid access for cleaning.



The Queen's Green Canopy

On Saturday 29th January 2022 Illogan WI along with Illogan Scouts, Cubs and Beavers planted a Native Bird Cherry Tree in the grounds of the Village Hall as part of the Queen's Green Canopy project to celebrate her Platinum Jubilee.

The tree was kindly donated by Andrew Tompsett who had propagated it from a cutting from an old Bird Cherry growing in the local churchyard. Andrew supervised the planting assisted by the Scouts and the WI.

Following the planting the WI served refreshments in the village hall to all those involved and guests. Andrew gave a short talk on the importance of trees and the ongoing care needed for our tree.

Thanks to all of those involved especially to Andrew and Illogan WI who organised the event.

The Old School Centre celebrates after receiving £9,773 in National Lottery funding

The Old School Centre, Illogan is celebrating today after being awarded £9,773 in funding from The National Lottery Community Fund, the largest funder of community activity in the UK.

The Old School Centre will use their funding to install a new Kitchen and utility room to enable groups with a social element to provide refreshments as part of their activity. The utility area will be accessible to groups using the Centre's Garden and will provide washing facilities for them and for craft groups using the Centre.

This new National Lottery funding will give all our visitors the opportunity to linger beyond their activity for a chat over a cuppa/snack whilst enjoying the Centre's unique tranquil spaces. It will take a few months to get all the

equipment in place but as soon as we are ready to go, we will be sending out invitations to welcome people back. We are looking forward to seeing existing supporters and to welcoming newcomers. The Old School continues to have an emotional attachment for many and we are dedicated to ensuring it remains a thriving part of the community through the facilities we offer as well as through our History Archive, The Playground Years.

Councillor Mike Jobson


