## Cornwall Councillor

### Councillor Dave Crabtree



I am pleased to say that after plenty of lobbying since September last year the residents of Park Bottom and Tolvaddon can once again get on one bus to get to Redruth and Barncoose Hospital without having to wait and change buses in Illogan. Feedback from residents is positive could I please ask residents to use the service as we do not want to lose it and if it is lost because of poor passenger numbers, it will be hard to get back.

After approximately four years of campaigning by myself, the Parish Council and our previous Cornwall Councillor, the alteration to the Bridge Road/Church Road junction has been carried out, which has narrowed the junction so that vehicles cannot go around the wrong side of the bollard from Robartes Terrace into Bridge Road.

The public consultation for the roll out of the 20mph speed limit throughout Illogan will take place in June/July with the implementation before the end of this year. Most roads are included within this except those that are 40mph zones, however I am pleased to say that the pedestrian entrance from the Gwel Karn estate onto Spar Lane, will hopefully now come out into a 20mph instead of a 60mph limit.

We are experiencing cars and motorcycles travelling through the area at excessive speeds and indeed one of our Community Speed Watch sessions caught 22 drivers in the space of an hour and recent Police operations in the village have also proved successful, with a large percentage of those caught living locally.

**The training covered basic CPR as well as how to use the Defibrillator.**

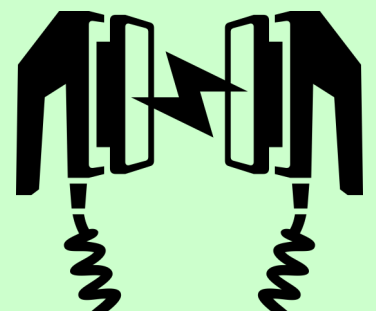
**Clr Gary Cullimore attended the event and said:**

## ILLOGAN HANDBELL RINGERS

To mark our 10th anniversary year we are holding a concert 'Time to Celebrate' at 2.30pm on Wednesday 7th June in the Parish Room at St. Illogan Church. There, on 23rd October 2013, some founder members were introduced to the art of 'in hand' handbell ringing. That may sound odd ....'aren't handbells always - in hand?', you may ask. Well 'yes', but not always.... There is another way, the 'off the table' way, in which bells are laid out on a table and picked up and put down each time they are rung. To us it looks a whole lot more complicated! Thankfully when, a decade ago, Janet Thomas, leader of the ringers at Perranarworthal, brought some of her team over to Illogan to get us going it was to demonstrate ringing 'in hand'. We learnt that handbell groups in Cornwall met up each year to play together and we were encouraged to join in at the next opportunity in March 2014. This we did, but using a borrowed set of bells as St. Illogan's bells were then not in tune with those of other teams, and needed repair and refurbishment as well as tuning.

The original 12 bells are well over 100 years old. Before refurbishment some still faintly bore the imprint 'W. B. & S.' revealing their origin in the foundry of William Blews & Sons who were casting church bells and handbells in Birmingham in the late 19th century. Intriguingly, the name 'Blews' pops up in documents related to mining in the Camborne and Crowan area in the 1850s, and specifically with Camborne Vean and Wheal Francis.

Since 2013 we have learnt a lot more about handbell ringing and enjoyed ringing music of all sorts. So on June 7th we will be taking a musical trip down memory lane. Refreshments will be available after the concert. Come and celebrate with us. Donations received will be shared equally between the British Heart Foundation and Cornwall Hospice Care.

## LOVE ILLOGAN? LOVE WILDLIFE?

### Welcome to Illogan Wildlife!

We are so fortunate to live in place that has diverse wildlife - animals & plants! A few of us have started this group so that we, as a community can help protect and conserve the wildlife we already have and also help with nature recovery, so that wildlife can thrive in our parish!

We are encouraging people to share their wildlife sightings, either in words or photos/videos, both with this group and also with ERRCIS - the Environmental Records Centre for Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly who encourages anyone to submit wildlife records, whatever your experience and no matter how common or widespread the species. On the Illogan Wildlife group page there is a link to their fab app ORKS (Online Recording Kernow and Scilly) which you can download onto a phone or other device or you can just upload records via their website [www.errcis.org.uk](http://www.errcis.org.uk). The ORKS website and app are developed and supported by Errcis, who are also hosted by Cornwall Wildlife Trust.

These wildlife records will help to conserve and protect our wildlife for future generations and can be used in decision-making, education, research, and promote more sustainable and environmentally friendly planning and development. (Note - it is a resource used by Cornwall Council).

Please feel free to share what you have seen around the village and in your gardens and use the APP to record them. It is important to be aware of the sensitivity of some species - especially badger, deer and nesting birds. Please don't share or show exact locations (the app also helps with this - and Errcis staff check and amend any sensitive records).

If you need help to record your sightings we can do that too.

We look forward to hearing & seeing what's out there!

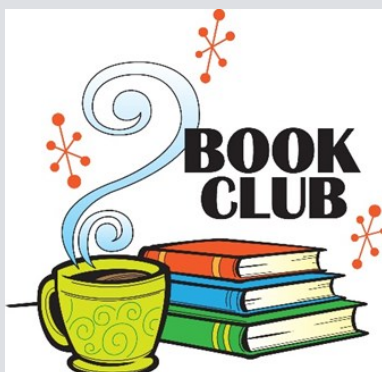
## Harris Mill Hall

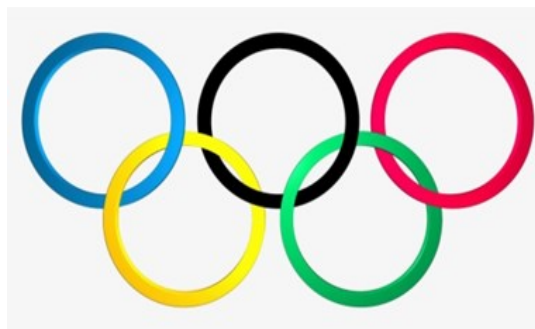


### An Olympian comes to Illogan School
