There has been recent press comments about the 20mph zones in various locations nationally and that they may be stopped, however I can confirm that in Cornwall, the 20mph is not covering all roads and indeed some will remain at their current limits and only those that appeared in the consultation earlier this year will fall into the scheme, subject to the majority of residents agreeing. The result of the consultation is due anytime now.

Many residents have complained about the 60mph limit along Illogan Downs and Cot Road and wanting a reduction, especially as visibility is poor near Tehidy Woods. Therefore, I can confirm that both Illogan and Portreath Parish Councils have supported me in my written request to Highways to have this limit reviewed, especially as it is difficult to see pedestrians and cyclists even on a summer's day because of the shade from the trees.

Whilst mentioning speed, as Illogan has a Speed Watch team made up of volunteers, we do qualify for extra support from the Police Speed Detection Team and a recent visit to Illogan found that no vehicles received an intention to prosecute letter on Broad Lane whereas 10 drivers were reported on Harris Hill, all of them local residents, so please watch your speed.

It is excellent news that the Café in Tehidy Woods has reopened with a new tenant. The first meeting of the Tehidy Country Park Advisory Group has now taken place and discussions took place on the possible restoration of the two lodges and kennels, which will be a long term project, as well as ensuring that the woods are accessible to all. As 88% of visitors are local it was reinforced that the woods should remain free to park.

As the next issue is not until next year, may I take this opportunity to wish you a good Christmas and a Happy New Year.

It was decided, after a walk around Illogan Park, Manningham Wood, the churchyard, the Village Hall and the Old School Centre that we were entered into the National competition! It was clear that the judges were delighted by our village. Their infectious smiles and friendly chat have given us motivation to drive forward for next year!

We are at the starting point of Britain in Bloom. The judges recognised the work that all the different community groups bring to the village and our communities wellbeing. We have been given some fantastic advice and guidelines that we can use to power forward with plans, ideas, and actions before next year's competition.

We have the facilities at Illogan Park as a prime example. The raised flower beds were full of weeds and were an eye saw. Help Us Save Lost Footpaths

Did you know there are over 49000 miles of footpaths in the UK that could be lost forever!

The government recently announced it would be implementing a deadline of 2031 to save these paths, despite announcing in 2022 that it wanted to remove the deadline. After 2031 we will no longer be able to claim rights of way based on historical evidence.

2031 may seem a lifetime away but when the deadline comes, the walk you once enjoyed, unless registered, will be no more. It's no easy undertaking to register the pathways but Illogan Parish Council are prepared to safeguard as many as we can.

We need your help to identify all those within our Parish and to highlight how frequently they are used, how important they are etc. You may be part of a walking group, or like to wander down routes less traveled, either way your input is vitally important!

There are two ways in which you can help.

If you like to put on your walking boots and head out into the depths of Illogan Parish, you could become a volunteer footpath warden with the Ramblers Association. You don't have to become a member to volunteer. You can find out more details on the Ramblers Association website (www.ramblers.org.uk), the more people they have helping, the more routes we can save for us and generations to come.

Illogan Parish Council is taking an active part in protecting our pathways. If you are unsure if your local pathway is registered, you can check on the definitive map using this link [Bit.ly/45ShzHd](https://bit.ly/45ShzHd) or pop into the office and look at the printed map.

If the pathway is unregistered, please contact us and we can start the process, we just don't know all the routes and need your help. Please come and see us in the council office, email, or call. Thank you for your help!

Greetings One and All. Are you, like us, wondering where the Summer went? With the mornings getting darker and the evenings drawing in, it certainly is feeling autumnal.

Here in Cornwall our mild winters often mean that hibernation does not take place until January or February, if at all, so there's no need to worry if a hedgehog is out at night, even when it's wet and windy, as long as it's not obviously injured.

A hedgehog out during the day is a cause for concern. If you see a hedgehog out during the daytime, please call us straight away, please don't wait a few hours as timing is crucial in these cases.

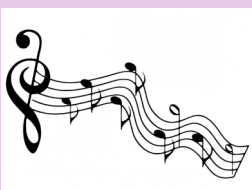

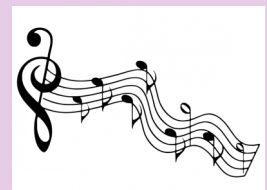

Illogan School – Ofsted Inspection

On 19th and 20th September 2023 Illogan School underwent an Ofsted Inspection and were joined by two Ofsted Inspectors who undertook a range of evidence gathering activities. This included observing lessons, checking records and gathered a range of evidence to inform their judgements, including speaking to staff, governors, pupils and parents and scrutinising pupils' work.

Inspectors also sat in on lessons, looked at children's work and talked to them about not just their understanding, but also how engaged they are in their learning, and about other issues like behaviour and bullying.

The inspectors concluded that Illogan is a 'GOOD' school, a benchmark that is high under the current Ofsted framework. We are delighted that the inspectors captured the many strengths of the school and recognised the hard work undertaken by all in the school community.

The inspectors graded Illogan Primary School 'GOOD' in all areas (Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, Leadership and Management and Early Years Provision), resulting in an Overall Effectiveness of **GOOD** for the School.

We consider this an excellent achievement for the school and are exceptionally proud of all staff and pupils. I am delighted that the hard work undertaken by the Illogan staff has been recognised. I am particularly pleased that Ofsted recognised the journey of improvements since the last inspection, and I would like to thank the parents/carers who have supported the school during this time.

The report highlights the many elements of good provision at Illogan School as well as the next steps to continue to move the school forward. What is very satisfying is that the areas identified were already within the school development plan prior to the inspection and several actions have taken place towards these already. Pupil News

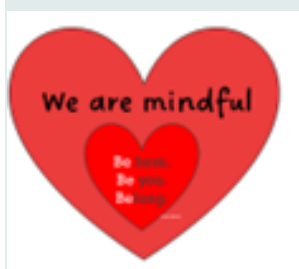


This year at Illogan School, we are learning about the Stone Age. I know that people had farms, but before they had farms, they had to move around. People were hunters and they used stone tools.

What is Walking Netball?

Walking Netball is a friendly and inclusive programme, allowing women the opportunity to find their place in the sport. It's netball, but at a walking pace where the rules are slightly tweaked. Usually held indoors, there are over 200 programmes running across the country all year round. Since its inception, more than 37,000 women have gotten involved in their local communities. Sessions are run by specially trained Walking Netball Hosts who run the activities and join in with all the fun and laughter! 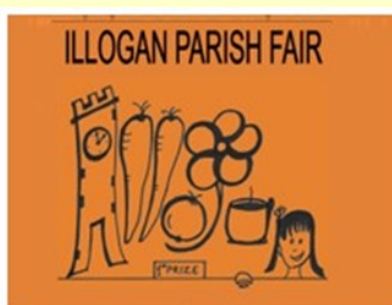
