10 years of Illogan Park

Celebrating a Decade of Growth and Community: 10 years of Illogan Park under Illogan Parish Council Ownership



2025 marks 10 years since Illogan Parish Council took over the management of Illogan Park, and what a transformative journey it has been! From taking ownership in 2015 to the vibrant, inclusive community space it is today, Illogan Park has evolved through dedication, consultation, and a shared vision for the future.

2015

Illogan Parish Council entered into negotiations with Cornwall Council to purchase the freehold of Illogan Park. An action plan was drawn up, a business plan compiled and extensive information gathering and negotiations with Cornwall Council began. Later that year the freehold was legally transferred to Illogan Parish Council.

2016 and 2017

In June 2016 and June 2017 public consultations were held to hear your ideas and aspirations for the future of the park.

2017

2017 saw the installation of a range of new play equipment and marked a new era for Illogan Park. An official opening was held to mark the occasion.



2021

The beginning of 2021 saw a comprehensive planning application submitted to Cornwall Council for the installation of public toilets, a car park and a perimeter path to increase accessibility and user comfort.

Later in the year the changing rooms were refurbished and the access lane, An Vownder, was resurfaced, enhancing access and safety.



2022

2022 marked a year of visible change with the public toilets and perimeter path being installed. December also saw the opening of the Illogan Parish Council Community Office—a place the Parish Council could call home and a new space for the community to use.

2023

The play area underwent resurfacing—improving the safety and aesthetics for users. A handrail was also installed at the Corner Entrance to improve safety.

10 years of Illogan Park

2024

Following a comprehensive consultation process in 2023, Outdoor Fitness Equipment was installed in the park promoting health and wellbeing for all ages.

2025

2025 has already seen improvements in the form of a brand new DDA-compliant roundabout, drinking fountain and SEND-accessible swing seat as well as additional inclusive play equipment.



A Thriving Community Hub

Illogan Park is now proudly home to multiple users of the football and rugby pitches including Speak Out Mental Health FC, Illogan Park RFC, Veor RFC, Cornwall Monarchs American Football Team and Carn Brea Dynamites Baseball Team. It also serves as the venue for the popular Illogan Fun Day, drawing families and friends together each year to celebrate our vibrant community.

The Community Room and outside space are also home to the ever expanding Craft and Food Market held on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month between 10am and 2pm. Come along and support local makers, bakers and creators.

Thanks to continuous improvement and thoughtful planning, the Park has become a valuable community asset - a safe, welcoming space for play, sport, wellbeing, and social connection.

What's Next for Illogan Park?

The vision continues with exciting upcoming projects:

A sensory garden with a dedicated yoga and meditation area—designed for relaxation, reflection, and mental wellbeing

More seating to enable users to pause and enjoy the surroundings

Covered seating and picnic benches in the green space opposite the office—perfect for families and community gatherings

Improved sports pitch drainage to reduce flooding and ensure year-round access.

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone who joined us for the VE Commemorations on 8th May.

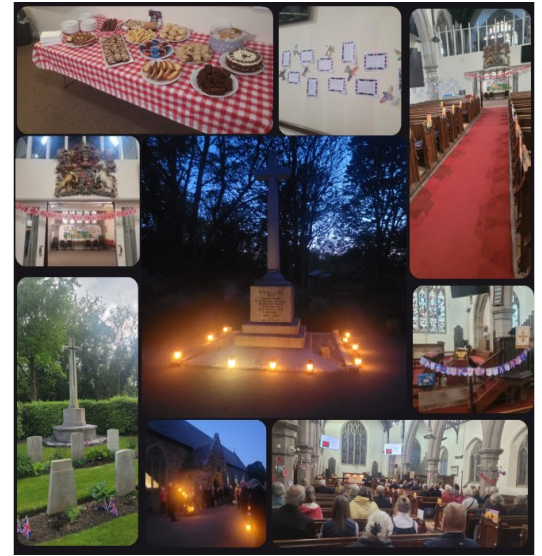

Our Brief History

The Community Netball project was born out of a Youth Consultation in Portreath in October 2023. Through conversations with parents and feedback from young people, Netball for juniors was highlighted as a need in the area.

Contact was made with Lastonet Netball Club, who are a locally established netball club for Seniors. They fully supported the need for a Netball Club for juniors in this area, having previously run a Junior League in Redruth for many years.

Having successfully recruited volunteers for Community Netball, we were able to start looking at how to fund future sessions. Portreath Parish Council secured funding from the Community Chest for the first 12-week delivery and another 12-weeks of funding was secured through Active Cornwall. Portreath Parish Council successfully applied for funding, through the Community Chest, which paid for our first 12-week delivery at Cornwall College.

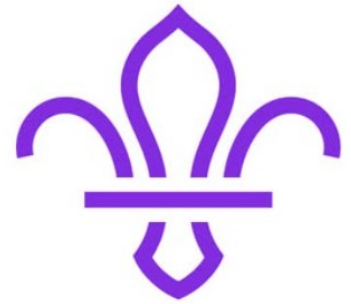

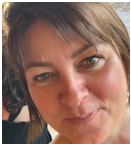

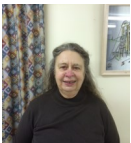
