Illogan Park

In recent months there have been a few new additions to Illogan Park.



Those of you with a keen eye may have seen the new drinking fountain. It provides a handy spot to hydrate or fill your water container. We believe it compliments the new fitness equipment and hope that many of you will make use of this added convenience.

We are delighted to announce the installation of a SEND swing seat in the play area. The seat is designed to provide extra support, comfort and ease of use for all children. The seat is for ages 3+, there is no maximum age as it is designed for all users and abilities, up to a maximum weight of 130kg (285lbs).



As many of you will be aware, the roundabout in Illogan Play Area had been out of action after becoming unsafe due to wear and tear. In January a replacement was installed and the roundabout is now back and ready to spin up endless laughter for everyone.



These latest improvements, along with some ongoing projects, are part of a broader commitment to keep the park safe, inclusive, and enjoyable for everyone!

Tolvaddon Bus Shelter

A Tolvaddon bus shelter which had its roof removed earlier this year for safety reasons, has now been replaced with a brand new structure – thanks, in part, to a £3,000 grant from Cornwall Council.



The shelter had deteriorated over time and became unsafe during recent storms. The roof was removed as a precaution to prevent injury or further damage.

With the shelter out of action, regular commuters were left exposed to the elements while waiting for buses.



Illogan Parish Council arranged the replacement of the shelter which now offers a modern, weather-resistant design intended to serve the community for many years to come.

Illogan Sparnon Silver Band

Founded in 1976, Illogan Sparnon Silver Band proudly supports local events by performing at concerts, summer carnivals, and Christmas celebrations. We are not only a fun and social group, but also enjoy performing a variety of music.

We participate in numerous brass band contests each year to elevate our performance standards. In 2024, we experienced a resurgence in interest and success, culminating in a 2nd place finish among a large field of bands at the Torquay Regional Championships.

In September, for the first time in our history, we had the privilege to compete in the National Brass Band Championships of Great Britain, hosted at Cheltenham Racecourse, achieving a commendable 9th place out of 18 other qualifying bands.

This year the band was praised for its outstanding performance at the Newquay Festival of Brass on February 1st, where we entertained a packed audience with our music.

Community Speed Watch

In Devon & Cornwall, local community groups - including Community Speed Watch (CSW) teams - are working together to reduce the number of fatal and serious collisions on our roads.

Camborne, Pool & Redruth Police are raising awareness via social media, which states that 'Speeding is one of the 'Fatal Five' most common causes of serious injuries and death on UK roads'.

About Your Local Group

The Illogan & Portreath CSW group was set up in November 2022. We are a small group of 7 active volunteers, and we currently cover 4 Community Speed Watch sites in our area. We can operate in 20 and 30mph zones between dusk and dawn.

Our main aim is to raise awareness of speeding and the potential harm that could be caused, by driving faster than the legal limit. Each year, an average of 28,000 people are killed or seriously injured on the roads in the UK - and research has shown that speed is often an contributing factor.



We work closely with, and are well supported by, our partners at Devon and Cornwall Police. Since June 2024 our group has increased the sessions and in 2025, we have achieved even more, we have delivered 11 sessions up until the end of March. We run the sessions on different days and times, to ensure we run sessions based on volunteer availability.

We listen to feedback from members of the public, passing on any information we are given to Community Speed Watch Head Office.

Based on feedback, we will look at setting up

new sites, where speed is believed to be an issue and is causing residents to feel unsafe.

We have recently been asked by members of the public to set up Community Speed Watch sites in Portreath Village itself, and there have been several incidents in the village in the past year, which has also evidenced a need.

We are pleased to advise that we have now had 3 sites confirmed, which we hope will go live after Easter.

How can you become a Volunteer?

We are always looking for more volunteers, so we can be more effective in raising awareness and reducing the speed in the Illogan and Portreath Parishes.

Becoming a volunteer is easy. All you need is to be able to complete the on-line & session training and ideally be able to offer an hour a month (or more).

Step 1 – Contact Vicki (Portreath & Illogan CSW Coordinator) at speedwatchcommunity@gmail.com

Step 2 – Complete the on-line training (quick and straight forward)

Step 3 – Attend a session to be trained by other volunteers, in how to use the speed gun and complete other activities at a session.

Harris Mill Hall

Illogan Heritage

The First Illogan Parish Council

The first Parish Council Elections were held in December 1894 following the setting up of Parish Councils in Cornwall, England and Wales. 22 candidates stood and 15 new councillors were elected. In 1894 women were not allowed to stand for election, or even to vote.

William Teague was the first Chairman elected and W. J. Uren was the first Vice-Chairman. Illogan Civil Parish was the 3rd largest in area in Cornwall and the boundaries were identical to those of the ancient Church Parish of St. Illogan. The parish stretched from Nine Maidens School 6 miles from Helston to Porthtown. Also from Penventon, at the top of Buller Hill, Redruth, to Reskajeage Downs on the North Cliffs (not far from Hells Mouth).

The first Council meeting was held in the Parish Vestry, Pool, on January 16th 1895. Its first discussion was following a letter from the Illogan Allotments and Small Holdings Association to give the new Parish Council advice on obtaining allotments for parishioners. The second debate was to formally complain to Cornwall County Council's two Illogan Councillors about there being no polling station in the recent Parish Election in the south of the parish, which meant that very few electors voted there. The Council asked for a future polling station at least in Carnkie.

The first Illogan Parish Council was abolished in 1935 and St Illogan remained unparished for 50 years when 8 new Parish Councils were elected in East Penwith in 1985, including the present Illogan Parish Council. It is 40% of its original size.

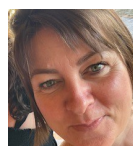

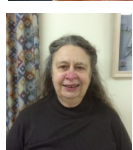
